## Saudi Food and Drug Authority (SFDA) –Anticholinergic Drugs and Cognitive Problems in Elderly

The Saudi Food and Drug Authority (SFDA) would like to notify Health Care Professionals (HCPs) that certain anticholinergic drugs might be associated with cognitive impairment and an increased risk of memory loss, known as dementia, in elderly patients. The risk appears to increase with high doses and with longer use of anticholinergic drugs.

The anticholinergic drugs are widely used for various conditions including vomiting, gastrointestinal spasms, bladder problems, Parkinson treatment, and depression. In addition, some of these drugs are available as over the counter (OTC) products such as antihistamines for allergy relief or sleep disorders.

On 2015, the SFDA reviewed all available evidence on the association of anticholinergic drugs with cognitive impairment and dementia in older adults. The SFDA concluded that there is a potential risk of cognitive impairment and dementia with long-term use of anticholinergic drugs and the general awareness about this risk is low.

A recent study followed 402 older adults with normal cognition (mean age, 73), 52 of whom were taking at least one medication with medium or high anticholinergic activity, for around 32 months. The study found that patients who regularly took at least one anticholinergic drug developed poor cognition, brain structure changes and less glucose metabolism in the brain, which may reinforce the concerns regarding this risk.

The SFDA emphasizes that anticholinergic drugs should be used with caution in elderly patients. The SFDA advises HCPs to consider the lowest effective dose of anticholinergic drugs with regular monitoring for the signs of confusion or dementia in elderly patients particularly when prescribing any of these drugs for a long-term use.
